The locals are friendly the drivers are courteous, the dogs seldom bark and never chase (unlike Mexican dogs!), the views are spectacular and the winds are always at your back! I loved this place! Hi Guys:

Let's see...I rode across Columbia (over three thousand people get kidnapped a year there, roughly ten a day!) and I wasn't one of them. It's a beautiful country. Do you think a guy with a degree in Chemistry could find work there? Ecuador was fantastic—what a wildly diverse country. I got caught in a mudslide in the Amazon rain forest and got terrible altitude sickness in a blizzard at 16,000 ft climbing the highest active volcano on the planet. Cool! Right now I'm in Trujillo, Peru. I just rode through a thousand kilometers of coastal desert. I could really use a cold coke! Unfortunately, most stores do not sell cold drinks. I guess football season is starting up again...what are the Pats doing about the quarterback thing? (Editor's note: The Pats traded Drew Bledsoe and kept Tom Brady. The rest you know!)

I should be going; my bike is on the street. Keep in touch, Rob

The next dispatch from our Man of the Great White North was from Chile when he wrote on 11/25/02:

Hi guys, it's far from chilly in Chile! In fact it's freakin' hot! That huge gaping hole in the ozone layer sure isn't helping.

I just rode across the Atacama Desert, the driest place on the planet! There was no shade, no stores, no restaurants, no hotels, no nothing! I stand corrected...there was Lots of Nothing! **MONDAY**      \*\*\* ENDED FOR THE YEAR \*\*\*

**Topsfield Plaza**, Topsfield. Leaders: **None**.

**NOTE:** This ride is now a Show-N-Go until next spring.

This is an arrowed ride through the quiet roads of Topsfield and the surrounding towns. The loops are approximately 15, 20 & 25 miles. The slowest riders will be accompanied by a leader. We will group riders by speed as we usually have a large turnout. Focus is on having a good time. New members are encouraged to attend. We usually gather afterwards to refuel. Come join us!

Directions: From Rte 95 N, take Exit 50 to Route 1 North. In Topsfield, turn left onto Rte 97 North. At Topsfield Center, go left (Rte 97 continues right). Topsfield Plaza lot is a block ahead on the right...we park at the far end of the lot.

TUESDAY *** Starts 6:00 PM ***

This location is only an 1/8 of a mile north of the previous Batchelder School location and the route will be the same. The Tuesday Night ride accommodates both experienced paceline riders at 18-21 MPH as well as novice to intermediate riders at 14-17 MPH. It is a hilly 15 mile ride that provides a good conditioning workout in an hour or less thru the Harold Parker State Forest yet is minutes from Rt. 128 and I-93. We always have someone to pair you off with so no one rides alone. Try us out!

Directions: From Rte 128 take Exit 40. Follow Haverhill Street 3.5 miles north to North Reading center. Continue straight across Rte 62 and turn left on Hill St; the second street on the left and just after the Union Congregational Church. Park in the upper Church parking lot; your first left on Hill St. From I-93, Take Rt. 62 EAST to Haverhill St, (cross Rt 28 to North Reading H.S.), left on Haverhill, 2nd Left on Hill St., left into Church parking lot.

WEDNESDAY *** Starts 6:00 PM, 5:00 PM beginning September 20th ***

Topsfield Plaza, Topsfield. Leaders: Eric Shaktman 978(948-7156) ericnsc@verizon.net

Average pace for these 18-35 mile rides ranges from 15-21 mph; multiple groups, sometimes even a tandem paceline! Length depends on daylight. An alternate shorter route is available each week. Cue sheet and map. Mix of flat, rolling, and hilly terrain. Routes vary from week to week. Bring \$\$\$ for pizza after ride.

Directions: From Rte 95 N, take Exit 50 to Route 1 North. In Topsfield, turn left onto Rte 97 North. At Topsfield Center, go left (Rte 97 continues right). Topsfield Plaza lot is a block ahead on the right...we park at the far end of the lot.

This is a fun ride with a great club feel; we go for pizza and laughs several times during the season. It is a 20 mile loop with multiple groups, come try to beat an hour! There is also a 13 mile cut off for our beloved turtles; you too should try for the hour! We usually finish together.

Directions: Rte 128 to Exit 40. Follow Rte 129 south (Wakefield) to the south end of the lake. Meet at or near the gazebo.

**When:** 9:00 for 20, 28, 40, 51 or 62 miles.

**Directions:** From I-95, take exit 54B, Rt. 133 east, to Ipswich Center; turn right 1 block before downtown center; Hammatt Street parking lot will be on your left. From Rt. 1 take Ipswich road east towards Ipswich; cross the RR tracks and turn immediate left; the lot will be on your right.

**What to expect:** Ride from Ipswich on back roads past Appleton Farms, through Bradley Palmer State Park, along the Ipswich River and past State forests through Topsfield and Boxford to North Andover with frequent shortcuts for shorter loops. **Directions:** I-93 N, Exit 45 River Road (1st exit north of I-495), Left at 1st set of lights onto River Road, left at 3rd set of lights into school parking. I-93N is Exit 40B off I-495.

**What to expect:** Twisty, scenic ride through Andover, Tewksbury, Billerica, Carlisle & Concord. No big hills. The 54 and 68 mile routes go through Concord Center. Refreshments following the ride.

**Directions:** From Route 95, take Exit 57 for Route 113 East. Go for 2 miles and take a left onto Kent Street. Parking lot is 2 blocks on right. From Route 1 go onto Merrimac Street (at the Newburyport end of the bridge over the Merrimack). Go 1/4 mile west towards Amesbury. Take a left at the gas station lot 1 block on left.

**What to expect:** This is a remake of the old Picnic at Maudslay Park ride with a new start. The loops go through scenic back roads of the Newbury's, Merrimack, Amesbury and along the Merrimack River. The medium and long routes go along back roads of southern New Hampshire. The long loop is hilly and goes through Exeter. There will be sandwiches and refreshments after the ride in Cushing Park.

**What to expect:** This is a great short ride that will seem as if you are seeking as many hills in as short a time as possible. There are lots of small stores along the route for refueling.

From Route 1 go onto Merrimac Street (at the Newburyport end of the bridge over the Merrimack). Go 1/4 mile west towards Amesbury. Take a left at the gas station lot 1 block on left.

**What to expect:** Scenic tour of the Merrimack River; the 25 mile loop is fairly flat; the 50 mile loop is varying.

Al lost a long battle with a degenerative bone marrow disease (MPD) last September. In his memory, on September 10, 2006, there will be bicycle rides of 13, 24, 45, and 65 miles starting at Regis College. The registration fee is \$35, and there is a minimum pledge requirement of \$100.

All proceeds will go to the MPD Foundation ([www.mpdfoundation.org](http://www.mpdfoundation.org)), which sponsors research into myeloproliferative disorders.

Tom Magliozzi, one of the Tappet Brothers from Car Talk, was a friend of Al's and will be riding, sending off riders, and leading the post-ride ceremonies.
